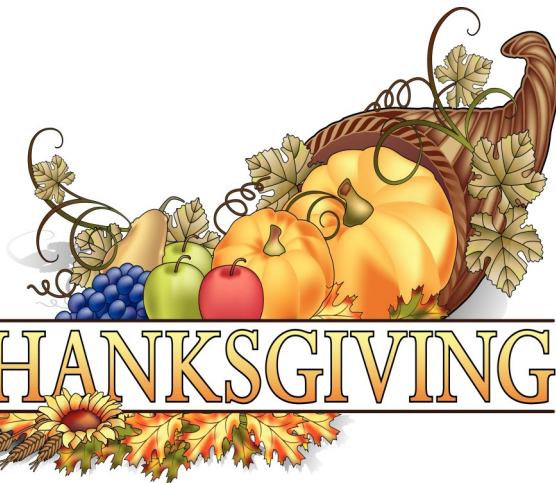
HELEN KELLER: A LIFE NEARLY LOST
