Technology (RFID update):

We have received 3 Envisionware Disc Readers and have ordered the software. Shawn Carlson from Bridges Library System will help us to install the software.

Each pad will require the RFID software

That software costs \$195 per pad – Here is a description of the software

“Provides integration with circulation clients, encoding, tag query, and RFID-enabling of ILS-specific self service circulation stations as well as control of the EnvisionWare Media Case Controller (EMC2) for simultaneous checkout and case unlock for all OneTime cases. Administer settings via a browser with the included CloudConnect online subscription

- Natively integrates with:

--- Polaris Staff Client, LEAP, and Express Check using Polaris RFID API

--- Innovative Millcirc, Sierra and Express Lane using Ill Item Status API

--- SirsiDynix Symphony circulation client using Symphony RFID API

- Integrates with TLC, Amlib, Softlink, Horizon, Evergreen and other ILS circulation clients using Universal Interface”

From Envisionware on 2-13-2023: The software is located in the customer center. Once you login to the customer center, go to the software and documentation tab. Then go to the CSI: EnvisionWare RFID Software Suite Tab. There is where you will find the software.

This was an unbudgeted expense for 2023 but I used Reserve Fund Technology dollars (almost \$1500) to pay for this.

We have received tags now from Bridges. I also purchased a tagging dispenser from Jefferson Public Library.
